Week 16 – Acts 5:29-42 A Lifestyle of Mission

Today is week 16 of the book of Acts; we are taking a little extra time to explain the idea of "a lifestyle of mission." We are going through the book of Acts because we want you to know what to look for in a church if you ever leave Santa Maria (or Element). Act's is both prescriptive and descriptive; it is a book describing what happened and, in certain cases, a book telling us what to do. This week, we learn that mission is for everyone, even you!

Where in life do you struggle to take a stand, (pick sides)?

Read Acts 5:39-42.

What has happened in the past (good & bad) when you *did* take a stand for something?

We see in this passage from Acts a Pharisee named Gamaliel. Gamaliel was the grandson of one of the greatest Rabbi's in Jewish culture; Hillel. He does not really know what to do with the Apostle's message of preaching in Jesus' name because he says *"for if this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail, if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them."* Gamaliel did not take a stand, he simply said the words he did in order to not rock the boat and to see how events would play out.

Why is it easier to keep that status quo rather than rock the boat?

Gamaliel's speech gives us a false dichotomy: withdraw from the world in way that misunderstands how God intends to use us (sort of like monks), or try to take over and impose our will through laws meant to curb behavior, but does nothing about people's hearts. Do you tend more toward legalism, fatalism, or somewhere in the middle? Legalism is following laws to force everything to work out a certain way; fatalism sees no hope in doing anything, so it most often gives up.

God throughout the scriptures has called His people not to fatalism or legalism, but to a third way, the way of mission. We do not withdraw, we do not always fight (sometimes you have to depending upon the situation), but we do what we can to show forth the will of God in ways that are available to us by building relationship and hope. We do SOME THINGS, the things God calls us to do, in a spirit of glorifying God and showing His grace.

In Jeremiah 29 God's people are in a pagan city, they have been captured and taken into exile. The Israelites are wondering how they are supposed to live because they are very confused, they have no temple, their rulers were awful, and their prophets were false. So God sends His true prophet with some instructions that are good for us as well.

If God spoke to you right now, what do you think He would call you to do?

God tells his people that they are where they are because He sent them there. He tells them to invest, love, and pour energy and life into their city. He tells them to marry, have children, and live as an example of what family is meant to look like in their city. God says to serve the city. This is a lifestyle of mission.

As soon as you take the name of Christ, Christ calls you to go and make disciples. We get to partner in God's mission!

What do you think of when you think of mission?

Do you know any missionaries?

That last question was a trick question; we are all missionaries! Yes, even you! **If you are Christian, YOU are a missionary.** The great myth is that "missions" is what we do around the world, where we send people to faraway places to tell people about Jesus. While that is true, a missionary is also you – sent to Santa Maria, Ca.

How can you invest in your city?

We don't sit back and keep the status quo like Gamaliel, we are sent to lift up the name of Jesus by doing justice, living in kindness, and walking humbly with God. We are meant to seek the peace and welfare of our cities in which God has placed us. We obey what God has revealed to us, just like the apostles, and continue preaching the good news of the NAME of Jesus by our actions and words.
