In what ways can you show your love for God by loving those He has created?

Man Maker

Genesis 1:27 "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."

God made man.

This idea is never up for debate in the scriptures, it is stated as straightforward simple truth. This truth should affect all of our lives. Man is not made in the image of angels, nor is there any indication that angels participated in the creation of human beings. Man is not made in the image of animals, nor is there any indication that animas participated in the creation of human beings. Random process and chance did not create human beings, nor does the scriptures give any indication that human life is at all random.

God made man...in His image.

In the ancient Near-East people held to the belief that a king was the visible representative of a deity; thus the king ruled on behalf of the god. Scripture, though, shows man made in God's image so he can exercise dominion over all the other creatures of the seas, heavens, and earth. Being made in God's image has multiple ramifications; one of which is that humanity is endowed with authority to rule the earth as God's representatives.

Being made in God's image also shows that men and women were intended to express God's image in relationship, particularly in well-functioning human community. This includes both in marriage and in wider society.

Being made in the image of God sets man apart from the other animals. Human beings resemble God by various characteristics:

- Reason
- Morality
- Language
- A capacity for relationships governed by love and commitment
- Creativity in all forms of art.

All these insights can be put together by observing that the *resemblances* (man is like God in a series of ways) allow mankind to *represent* God in ruling, and to establish worthy *relationships* with God, with one another, and with the rest of the creation.

But being made in the image of God does not mean man is, or ever will be, God. We are creation, He is creator.
