APPLICATION



How can you live, at your workplace, as a better example of Jesus and His work ethic?


Is there anything you are doing at work that detracts from the name and fame of God's work?

Week 6 FAMILY & GROUP DISCUSSION

Work

Genesis 2:1-3 "Thus the heavens and the earth were finished," and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation."

Throughout the unfolding drama of redemption, the Bible addresses the important and practical issues of life: love, hate, fear, hope, need, desire, family, money, work, play, war, peace, and so on. The Bible consists of real history about real people who shared the same type of concerns that we face today; though, of course, there are differences between then and now.

Usually Jewish families were strong units that were not easily broken. Not only were parents to help their children develop skills necessary for living, they were also constantly to teach their children about God's great acts in history (e.g., the Exodus) and what God required of them. Learning always centered on God, His works, and His Word.

Understanding that God is a God who works, the Jewish people understood that work itself was a gift given to mankind by God. The Bible sets up the pattern of work and rest (more work than rest).

Your work should be part of God's work in the world. We work because our God works, and we are created in His image.

Some truth about work:

- Work is more than what you get paid to do. Biblically all we do is work even if you don't get paid, so do it well.
- Work is a not evil. In Genesis 1 and 2, work is given BEFORE the FALL. God works. Work was one of God's gifts to us; we need to see it like that.
- **Christian's should work harder than all.** God made us to work, and proper understanding of God means we work hard and well.
- Sometimes people should go hungry. Just because someone is poor doesn't mean they are godly. There are legitimate needs, and there are needs that stem from laziness.

- As a Christian all work is Christian work. What makes a job "Christian" is the person doing the job.
- God has already told you what to do: WORK.
- If you want to work in "church ministry" you should prove your faithfulness by working a "normal" job. Jesus was even a carpenter for 30 yrs before His public ministry.
- When at your job, you should work. If you are getting paid to do a job and you aren't doing it, you are stealing.
- Work with skill. Show up on time.
- Work hard with your hands. When you get a skill, you keep working on it to get better.

Most importantly, you work for Jesus. *Col 3:23 Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men.*
