TODAY'S VERSES:

"Faithful are the wounds of a friend."

Proverbs 27:6

We are in a series called "Legends of the Fall," all about the "bad" people or the "bad" stories in the bible and how it relates to who we are today. We tend to want to look at "bad" guys in a story and say "that could never be me because I'm really a good person," but we are exactly like those bad guys. Today we look at the story of David and Bathsheba.

What was the best day you ever had? What was the worst day you ever had?

There are two stories people remember about the life of King David, his highest triumph (when David slew the giant Goliath) and his lowest personal defeat (when David gave in to personal temptation and slept with a woman who was not his wife). For every Goliath we seem to be able to defeat, there is a temptation, like Bathsheba, waiting to take hold of our hearts.

Is it easier for you to fall into temptation/sin when life is going well or when life is bad?

When you sin, do you try to cover it up?

Throughout scripture, we see people trying to hide from their sin; Adam and Eve hide their nakedness, Cain states, "Am I my brothers keeper," and King David tried to get Bathsheba's husband to sleep with her so he could avoid the consequence of his sin. David's cover up did not stop at that, his actions eventually resulted in the death of Bathsheba's husband. The pattern here is that sin begets more sin.

Where in your life do you need accountability?

People are incredibly gifted at deceiving themselves; it is an idea called "cognitive dissonance." We say we believe one thing, but live our lives completely different and are blinded to the discrepancy. You can have the greatest intentions, but trying to live our lives on our own is a disaster. It is easy to start a new pattern of sin, but it is almost impossible to ever end it on our own.

What is the difference between confronting someone out of love, or out of anger? Have you ever been lovingly confronted about your sin?

Read 2 Samuel 12:1-4

It is easy to look at the sin of someone else and identify the consequence, it is harder to have that sin revealed to us.

Do you get fired up about someone else's sin, but overlook your own?

Read 2 Samuel 12:7-9

Nathan does not hold back, he understands that giving David a half-truth is just as damaging as not saying anything.

Where in your life are you tempted to give people half-truths?

Telling people what they want to hear is not love, and shying away from sin is not love. When people are in destructive behavior, they need to be shown a mirror. Nathan loved David and God so much that he was willing to die to tell David the truth.

Who is your Nathan?

Is there anyone you have invited to tell the truth to you?

I (Jon) love looking at the story of David, both his best day and his worst day. They remind us that no matter how good we are, we are not exempt from falling into sin. The truth is we NEED a deliverer! The good news of this tragic chapter is that the history of God's people did not finally rest even on David. Despite being a "man after God's own heart," and despite the fact that David knows how to repent sincerely in the wake of grievous sin, David cannot save God's people. He too is weak, just like us. He fails, just like us. A son of David needed to come who would not fail. In Jesus Christ, this Davidic heir arrives, our Savior comes.

What is your understanding of Repentance and Grace?
