
# THANK YOU FOR **JOINING US TODAY!**

# 07 JUDAS



In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, "Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry."

Acts 1:15-17

Welcome to Legends of the Fall Week 7. We took 12 weeks during our summer series Coloring Book All-Stars to look at the "heroes" of the bible, those you would see in the pages of coloring books. We saw how all the "good" guys (except Jesus) were flawed just like we are.

In Legends of the Fall we are taking 10 weeks to look at the villains in the bible, those that everybody considers the "bad guys." We are looking at how we are not as different from them as we might think. Today, we take a look at THE BETRAYER, Judas Iscariot.

## Who do you think of when you think of a traitor?

The most infamous traitor in Scripture, other than the Devil, is Judas Iscariot, the betrayer of Christ. Judas is a guy that we love to hate, we often think we are so much better than him, but in reality we have all betrayed Christ in one way or another.

Have you ever been betrayed? How did that feel? Have you ever betrayed anyone else? How?

Jesus knew Judas and what he was capable of doing before He ever called him. Judas, along with the other disciples, were chosen after Jesus prayed all night about His decision. We must understand that Judas' betrayal wasn't a surprise to Jesus; God the Father answered Jesus' prayer about who was to be part of disciples. It was part of God's plan to choose Judas to accomplish

His redemptive work, even though he was called a "devil," which can also be translated "accuser or slanderer." Jesus chose Judas purposefully, and He called him to be with Him and learn from Him and to be loved by Him.

## Read John 6:64-71

Think of someone who has betrayed you, would you be upset if that person is in Heaven?

Is there anyone who would be surprised to see you in heaven?

What do we know about Judas?

- 1. He was a hypocrite He put on a good religious show for all the others.
- 2. He was a thief He was always looking for a way to personally gain.
- 3. He was a betrayer Judas was the person that God used in order to "hand over" Jesus to the temple priests.
- 4. Judas delivered (or 'betrayed') Jesus to the authorities for 30 pieces of silver with a kiss.
- 5. Judas confessed his sin, repented, and tried to return the money He confessed his sin to the chief priests and elders which was customary.

Where in life do you refuse to let go of your own plans? What are you trading Jesus for?

Are you willing to trust Jesus when life doesn't go how you desire or plan?

Judas' life and death shows us the difference between the law and grace. The law cannot pardon sin, as there is no hope in the law for forgiveness without atonement. Judas probably felt that the only thing left for him to do was to atone for his own sin by taking his own life, so he committed suicide.

## How do you try to atone for your own sin?

The law brings death, but grace brings life through the death and sacrifice of Jesus. After all of Judas' time with Jesus, even after his betrayal of Jesus, Judas still couldn't see the truth, that Jesus, who was full of grace and truth, was making atonement for sin—even Judas' sin, even our sin.
