

01. EPHESUS FIRST LOVE & BOMB SHELTERS

REVELATION

Search me, O God, and know my heart!
Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!
Psalm 139:23-24

Welcome to Element's second sermon series of 2015; Churches of Revelation. Keep in mind, this series will not be about the end times, but instead will be focusing on Jesus (shocker) and the examination of our souls. We are starting a season that some from other traditions would call Lent, which is the preparation of the believer through prayer, penance, and repentance to reflect on what Jesus has done and continues to do.

Have you participated in Lent before? What is your understanding of Lent?

Lent is a time where we allow God's Spirit to probe our hearts as we confess our sins, it is a season of repentance where we look at what God's light shows when He invades our souls. It is meant to be a journey that eventually leads us through reflection and into the joy of Easter and resurrection.

Read Revelation 2:1-7

This passage tells the history of a church that was filled with the passion of the gospel, but a generation later, the church has become self-focused. Many scholars will point out that THIS CHURCH started because they understood that the world needed to hear the good news of Jesus, THEY WERE BOLD fresh and creative, but somewhere they lost that passion and impulse.

How did you feel when you first followed Jesus? Do you find that you are now more or less excited about your faith?

Mission is the life purpose of every person who calls Jesus his or her savior and Lord. Our mission is first to glorify God, but then become

disciples who make disciples. We are to live in the hope and grace of the gospel, that God has rescued and saved us and we now spread that excitement about redemption to everyone.

What do you think of the idea of church as a bomb shelter?

The church is not designed to be a place of refuge away from a dark and pagan culture, it is supposed to be a light and a blessing. The church in Ephesus had "abandoned the love you had at first." Revelation 2:5 says, "repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lamp stand from its place, unless you repent."

Do you feel you are living your life for you or God? Where has your heart for mission become more of a heart to find like-mined people who are easier or simply those who already love Jesus?

The word "witnessing" strikes unneeded fear into too many people who profess belief in Jesus. We think the word means passing out tracks or being able to prove ourselves right and everyone else wrong, but Jesus relates witnessing like this: Matt 5:43-45 "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." It becomes a completely new proposition when witnessing becomes living the gospel, in tangible ways, to our neighbors. It means that the mission is not having to prove we "right," but simply living the hope that Jesus has given to us for the world to see.

Who do you need to share the gospel with?

If Jesus is truly our first love, living the Gospel simply makes sense in light of His grace given to us.
