Week 11 – Acts 4:23-31: Community That Encourages Us

We are in our series on the book of Acts! This is week 11 and we are looking at the amazing nature of the community that Jesus calls us to be part of.

Who do you surround yourself with? How do your friends currently effect your behavior?

How have your friends, in the past, effected your behavior?

Often times our personality does not arise in isolation, the majority of who we are happens because God uses people to form people. This idea in psychology is called "The Looking Glass Self," the way other people view us and treat us is one of the largest indicators of who we become. Provers 27:17 says, *"Iron sharpens Iron, and one man sharpens another."* This is why what happens between you and another person is never merely human to human interaction, it is spiritual. God's Spirit longs to be powerfully at work in every encounter. If you have friends that love Jesus, that love for Him should be infectious and eventually you might begin to live that way too.

What/who is the most meaningful relationship in your life?

Read Acts 4:23-31

The church, when faced with persecution, did not give up, but boldly spoke the truth of the Gospel. Against all odds, the church grew. It is important to remember the church is not a building, it is a people, a community of people, who love Jesus and encourage one another. In Acts 4, there is a pattern that is clearly illustrated throughout scripture. According to Tim Keller the pattern is as follows: restoration, renewal, and revival. When things get hard in your life, do you find yourself giving up or pressing on?

Do you want God to come down into the church in an intensely personal way?

Do you want Jesus to come into your life in an intensely personal way?

That is what a true community should pray for. This is a theology of renewal, visitation, and revival. Revival is a work of God in which the church is both beautified and empowered because the normal operations of the Holy Spirit: conviction of sin, enjoyment of grace, and access to the presence of God, are intensified.

How would you define revival?

According to Tim Killer there are three main characteristics of a revival.

- 1) There is an outpouring of the Spirit on believers. This means that the presence of God is among believers in such a way that we begin to actually find Christ more real to us than ever.
- 2) As a result of the outpouring of the Spirit, the people of the world are attracted to, and sought out by believers.
- 3) There is an impact on the community and society surrounding the church.

Have you ever experienced revival?

What is true community?

Encouraging community is not high fiving each other over a win, it is a constant encouragement of one another to proclaim the gospel of redemption and truth in all things. We must be a people who invite each other in to a revived community that encourages each other to live in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

How are Christians today part of the problem instead of the solution?

How have we made Christianity personal and not communal? What would it look like for the church to truly be living on mission? How can we encourage one another to live on that mission?
