
THANK YOU FOR JOINING US TODAY!

Week 29 – ACTS 10:1-43 A Common Vision

Peter preaches the Gospel to those who were once considered unclean, common, and profane. Peter will speak of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection from the dead because that is what cleans us and gives us right standing before God. As created beings, we have authority to speak for God only in regards to: Jesus' death, resurrection, and forgiveness of sins through His name.

How have you experienced other people trying to speak for God in a way that doesn't tell of the good news of Jesus?

Where have you tried to speak for God and lost focus on the good news of Jesus?

Jesus says to the religious leaders in His day, "the temple you have built, the animals you have killed, the blood you have shed, is now unnecessary." All of it finds fulfillment in Jesus.

- The Temple where sin was atoned for – that's now in Jesus
- The Temple where people came and worshipped God – that is now in Jesus.
- The Temple where the priest interceded before God for people – that is now in Jesus (our great High priest).

Why do you attend a corporate worship service (like a Sunday morning church service)?

Do you gather hoping to be entertained?

Do you gather with the expectation and hope that God will challenge you and lead you deeper in your relationship with Him?

If so, what does that look like?

What do you call "clean" or "unclean"?

After the message, what do you think a "common vision" means?

Everybody has a desire to be "rich." We all think we would handle finances better than other people who are rich, because we secretly see ourselves as being better than them. APPLICATION - Read 1 Timothy 6:17-19.

Have you ever had the thought that if you just had "more money" you would then become "more generous?"

Why do we tend to think we need to reach or attain the "next level" to do give more generously? How can you find a way to be generous *now*?

How often do you use what God has given you to bless others?
