The researchers Lea and Webley coined a metaphor for American culture and our use of money. They say money is a tool and also a drug. They say, "For a long time economists thought of money only as a tool. We value money because it's useful." Money does lots of useful things as a medium of exchange. For example, we can pay the bills to keep our lights on and stay fed, but, they point out, if money is only a tool, then why do people who have a lot of it want more? This shows, they say, "Money is also a drug." Money makes us feel things we would not otherwise feel and gives us a temporary escape from reality with the illusion of wellbeing.

DISCUSSION

Give some examples of money being used as a tool and as a drug in our culture.

EXPLANATION

Based upon how you use money, would you say money (for you) is a tool or a drug? How?

Do you feel tempted to make money a drug in your life?

APPLICATION - Read Proverbs 30:15, 1 Timothy 6:9 and Matt. 6:24.

When are you most prone to forget that God is the owner of everything? If you were to die today (I know, morbid thought), what money regrets would you have? What things would you rejoice over?

How can an eternal mindset change how you handle money today?

MISSION

In what ways do you, or don't you, equate giving with worship? What would your kids, friends, and/or family learn about money by watching your life?
