Recap From Week I

History of Ideas

- I. Pre-modern Era (precedes the 17th century)
 - Belief in the supernatural
 - Belief in realism
 - Objective Reality outside of ones own perception
 - World is Designed for a purpose (Teleology)
 - Language Can convey truth and realty
 - Creature/Creator Distinction
 - God is the center of Truth
 - Major Thinkers: Augustine (354 -430), Thomas aquinas (1225-1274)

2. Modern Era (Around 1789 French revolution time until fall of Berlin Wall 1989??)

- Started with Enlightenment
- Not complete rejection of pre-modern ideas
- Increasing Secularism
- Age of Reason, Scientific Discoveries
- Bible invalid if it can not stand up to the bar of reason
- The embracing of naturalism
- Human reason alone can bring knowledge and understanding of mankind
- Truth has to be proven with absolute certainty



- Skepticism
- Man is the center of truth
- Scientific Positivism, Logical Positivism
- Immanuel Kant (1724 1804) first major break away from enlightenment towards post modernism (Critique of pure reason)
- Major Thinkers: Renee Descartes (1596 1640), John Locke (1632 1704), Karl Marx (1818-1883), Friedrich Nietzsche (1844-1900), Sigmund Freud (1856-1939)

3. Post Modern Era (After WWII. Nietzsche was a forerunner in thought)

- Relativism
- · Religion is a bad word
- Doctrine is bad
- Language cannot convey truth and meaning
- Spirituality is a good word
- No such thing as objective truth. Everything is subjective
- the deconstruction of language itself
- Major Thinkers: Martin Heidegger (1889- 1976), Jacques Derrida (1926 1984), Jean-Francois lyotard (1924-1998)
- Postmodernism in art
- Postmodernism in movies
- Postmodernism in architecture

What is Postmodernism?

- Philosophy that affirms no objective truth or reality especially in regards to religion or spirituality.
- that may be true for you but not for me
- It is a rejection of modernism. It seeks to correct modernism by denying absolute truth
- PM has deep suspicions of meta narratives (grand stories). It is a world view that denies world views.
- Largest area PM has had influence in the area of language. Language according to PM cannot convey truth or meaning
- Truth and meaning pop into a page as someone reads
- Not interested in reality
- Is PM New?? No....
- Religious Pluralism. All religions are equally true and valid



Some Positive Elements of Postmodernism

- Recognizes that the ideologies of modernism have oppressed people
- Recognizes in spite of modernism optimistic view of humanity, individuals suffer from power, greed, etc..modernism taught people were by nature good.
- We don't have to be afraid of Plausibility and Probability

Some Negative Elements of Postmodernism

- rejection of worldviews so it is self defeating. Its the grand story that rejects all other grand stories.
- You can't know nature of realty. PMs deny you access and conceal for themselves what they deny for you. no one has access to ultimate realty

Postmodern and Oneism Correlation

- Rejection of truth ushers in interfaith movement. All religions become equally valid. Imagine all the people
- Because PM has shown atheism and rationalism to be bad, it helps usher in New forms of spirituality.
- Rationalism and PM have left a gap in any meaning to life which had helped usher in paganism and new spirituality
- PM says all claims to truth are power plays. Paganism is about removing imperialism.
- Both reject objective realty and truth
- Both emphasize experience even if that experience is fallible and relative to others experience
- Both would affirm that all paths in life are valid
- Doctrine is bad
