During the summer we did a series titled Coloring Book All-Stars (about the heroes you would find in children's bible coloring books). We are now in a series titled Legends of the Fall (about all the bad guys in the bible). We travel through these two series in an effort to be able to see how the people in the bible are just like us, lost and in need of God's redemption.

What is the best and worst advice you have ever received?

The central premise that we will continue to come to in the story of Absalom, is that we all need trusted friends in our lives who will speak the truth of the Gospel ("you are in sin, God is calling you, surrender").

Who in your life do you allow to speak truth? Do you desire to be flattered or hear the truth? Ask people around you what they think you want to hear.

Sin is insidious, it gets deep inside of us and convinces us that our motives are pure and right, while making us think everyone else is wrong. The story of Absalom is a spiral that starts with David and Bathsheba (2 Sam 11-12) > then moves to Amnon (2 Sam 13) > and ends up with David's son Absalom.

Just like every character in Legends of the Fall, our misplaced affections make us want to put ourselves in the place of God. In the book of Genesis we come to realize that "sin" is many things....

- Sin is the disruption of shalom. The peace and the rightness of what God created.
- · Sin is rebellion. We rebel against God's order of things.
- Sin is participation in the way of death, when we steer things in the opposite direction of God.
- · Sin is missing the mark.

How would you personally define sin?

In what ways have you seen sin spiral out of control (in your life and others lives)?

Augustine said that all sin stems from pride. In the story of David and Bathsheba, David is only able to repent of his adultery with Bathsheba, and the murder of her husband, by a trusted friend stepping into his life and speaking the Gospel truth to him (you are in sin, God is calling you, surrender). When Absalom spirals into sin he has no one in his life who will speak the truth in an unmitigated way to him. He has people who can easily manipulate him by appealing to his fear as well as his vanity. Absalom progresses into the places he does because no one trained him in understanding the grace found in true wisdom.

Read Proverbs 27:6

If someone were to manipulate you, would they be better off using praise or fear? Why? How are a friend's wounds to be trusted?

Do you understand the great privilege God gives us by being in relationship with each other? Relationship is not so we judge one another based upon our sins; it is having the guts to speak the truth into each other's lives because we all need it.

When was the last time someone spoke hard truth to you? How did you react?

Has anyone ever said you are selfish, sinful, and worship yourself? When someone gets in our face our first reaction should be "is there any truth in this." We are a people who are horribly self-centered which leads to us being incredibly lost.

We have all gone our own way and yet, just like David pardoned his enemies, God sends Jesus to pay the penalty for our sin and pardon us. We have relationship with God because of Jesus. God is redeeming, God is loving, and God is calling us home.

Is there a truth that God is speaking into your life right now that you are failing to listen to?

How can you become better at speaking the Gospel into others lives?

God has revealed to us our nature, but He has also redeemed us, and provided a way for salvation. As we live out the truth of the gospel, we live it out in each other's lives.
