
## THANK YOU FOR JOINING US TODAY!

# O<sub>3</sub> BABEL



Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth."

### Genesis 11:4

Welcome to our 3rd week of Legends of the Fall. Legends of the Fall is like the opposite of our previous summer series where we looked at the "good guys" in the Bible, now we are looking at the "bad" people, or the "bad" stories of the Bible. Many of the things that we look at throughout this series are things we tell ourselves we would never do, and yet we typically fall right into it. Hopefully, by the time we are done with all of these stories the "good guys" from the last series won't look so good (other than Jesus), and the bad guys won't look so bad, and we will realize we are just as lost and broken as them.

Today, we look at the Tower of Babel.

### Read Genesis 11:4

What is something you are proud of and others should praise you for? What happens when no one notices how proud you are of your own accomplishments?

The people of Babel were proud of their tower, but the language in the Bible shows that God was not impressed with their works. *Genesis 11:5 But the LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the men were building.* Sometimes we are so impressed with our own works that we think God has to also be impressed, but no matter how good we think we are, we cannot earn God's favor.

How have you tried to earn God's favor?
What do you do when you feel exposed, lost, and unsafe?

The people of Babel built a tower to try and handle their fears by trying to gain three things:

- strength,
- · security,
- · significance.

The problem with the people of Babel is that they looked to what they could do instead of what God wanted for them. The tower of Babel is a lot more than humans doing something wrong and God teaching them a lesson. The story is, once again, the problem of Genesis 3. There is an assumption that mankind thinks they know what they need better than what God knows they need.

What do you think you need?

Is there anything you think you need that God h

Is there anything you think you need that God has stopped you from attaining?

What makes you feel significant?

When we do not trust God, we find ways to provide strength, security, and significance for ourselves. We do this in our own effort with our own resources (just like the tower of babel). Today, we build towers out of our careers, our families, our stuff, or our intellect. When we try to find our hope in our own resources we will ultimately find it all empty.

How do you act to people who are not like you? Who can you try and love despite them being different than you?

Community is funny. We are called together (remember that book?), but we are also called to disperse and connect with people not like us. Humans like people who are like us (same social class, same ethnic background, same beliefs) and fear people who are different from us.

We must remember that God says when we follow Him we can stop living in fear and truly become unified in Jesus. The barriers that separate us should be discarded in the church, not because of our similarities, but because we love and serve the same God, Jesus.

Read Revelation Rev 7:9-10

How does God's rescue of the people at Babel point to how Jesus came and rescued us?
