RECAP & DISCUSSION STARTERS:

Genesis 1:27 *“So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them...”* These words were unique in the ancient world, men do not bear or reflect the image of God any more than women. All humankind is made in God’s image.

- **In the beginning there were no Bible verses that sounded anti-women.**

God creates men and women distinct and equal where they were meant to live together in harmony with God and one another.

- **We are the ones who brought inequality because of our sin.**

God gives prescriptions for humankind, and they decide to not listen to God and break relationship with Him.

- **God still brings hope in the midst of our sin.**

We must teach our children that God made women and men alike to serve in their giftedness with humility and joy and that we are all saved by the grace of God, not based upon our gender or our works.
