## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Luke: 18:14 - "I tell you this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other, for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

#### INTRODUCTION

The scriptures present believers with a great volume of information to consider. Some issues the Bible is firm and others are left to the interpretation of the reader; the former are called closed handed issues and the latter are called open handed issues.

#### **NOISSUDZION**

What things are you dogmatic about? (this doesn't refer just to the bible, this could be the your favorite hockey team to your favorite ice cream).

How do you treat people who disagree with your dogmatic idea(s)?

#### **€XPLANATION**

What Biblical issues do you consider closed issues?

What Biblical issues do you consider to be open handed issues?

Have you ever changed your mind about the nature of an issue, and what caused the change?
