MY NOTES:

#### EXODUS 20:7

"You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

MATTHEW 7:21-23 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'

If you are anything like me, this is a scary set of verses. Jesus is speaking to people who have knowledge of Him, are emotionally invested in Him, and are actively involved in ministry but yet He does not "know" them. The word "know" means intimate knowledge, or relationship. Imagine the fear that grabs hold of these individuals when Jesus says, "I never knew you; depart from me," personally I have shivers just thinking about it.

This week, we learned about the power of names, specifically, God's name. In Exodus, the third commandment God gives us is "You shall not take the name of your Lord God in vain..."

Have you ever used someone's name to help you open a door?

Before this sermon, what was your understanding of the Third Commandment, "You shall not take the name of your Lord God in vain?"

Names hold fundamental power, and when we use names the power of that individual name is transferred to us. Using someone's name implies that we have a relationship with that person and they are in agreement with us. Both Matthew 7 and the third commandment are about hypocrisy. If we claim Christ's name, we must act as Jesus would actually act. God's name opens doors that no other name can; if you claim His name you are made an heir of salvation, an heir of eternity, and an heir of Glory. If you use God's name should be a corresponding reality that you actually have a relationship with Him. When Jesus says, "depart from me," He is showing that it is not

enough to have orthodox doctrine, emotional involvement, and be active in ministry, there needs to be a spiritual reality to it...there needs to be a relationship behind it.

How do we develop a spiritual reality?

- First we MUST submit our will to His will. Why? Because He is our King. That means we cannot hold on to what we believe or want to be true, we live the truth that He has revealed to us.
- Second, in order to be truly free in this relationship, we must understand grace.

What are some things that you try and hold on to as right and wrong for you?

Why is it so hard for us to let go of what we want to be right or wrong and simply trust God?

If we do not submit our lives to Jesus by saying, "I give up my independence. Show me what the will of the Lord is, and I will do it. I don't care how I feel. I don't care what my friends say. I don't care what popular opinion is. I don't care what the experts say," you are taking God's name in vain. Pride runs deep into humanity, we like to believe that we are in control, and we have the power to determine what is right and wrong for ourselves. We cannot make the jump from our state of pride to a place of submission without God's help. But God has helped us because He loves us. If you are struggling with this, repent of your sins and ask Jesus to be the King of your life.

How have you dishonored God's name?

C.K. Chesterton says, "The only good argument against Christianity is Christians."

How do you take the name of Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior?

Timothy Keller says, "Lord, my intellectual faith, my intellectual doctrine is incomplete. My emotional love for you is cold. My best deeds of service are tainted with selfishness, but I ask because of what Jesus did for me, I ask because he died my death, he lived the life I should've lived, because he did these things for me, O Lord God, welcome me, accept me because of what he did, not because of anything I've ever done. I know the minute I do that, O Lord God, all of the value of his life and record will accrue to me."
