Because of our modern western mindset, we tend to view miracles as either relegated to the past or something that happens to others and not to us. Different words are used for miracles in the New Testament, like "wonders", "signs", "mighty acts", and "powers." The Hebrew word for miracle ( $m\hat{o}p\bar{e}t$ ), can mean any one of these things.

Today there is a lot of confusion when it comes to the subject of miracles. Many people fail to see that Scripture does not usually distinguish between the miracle of God's constant sovereign providence and the miracles brought about by His particular acts. In the Old and New Testament belief in miracles are set in the context of a world-view which regards the whole of creation as continually dependent upon the sustaining activity of God and subject to His sovereign will.

When the biblical writers refer to the mighty acts of God, or even the miracles of Jesus, they do not distinguish them from many acts of nature because they see them as a result of God's sovereign power (which they are). In the text we look at today in Mark 8:22-26 we see Jesus' sovereign power **and** His healing grace as **one thing**. He does what He does to teach His disciples, and us, that God wants us to see clearly in our lives, because too often we see as through a fog.

We must become a people who trust God to grow us and heal us in the way that He sees fit because we are His children.

#### INTRODUCTION

Jesus knew what the man saw when He was healing him, Jesus asks the question He does in Mark 8 for a purpose, to teach His disciples (and us). It is Jesus who rescues and Jesus who saves. The truth is that we are blind because of our own sin, but the beauty of the Gospel is that Jesus died and rose in our place to bring us back to God so we can be a people who truly see again.

#### Discussion

What questions do you have about the Bible that make you go "what in the world?"

Have you ever been asked a question which you couldn't answer?

#### EXPLANATION - Read Mark 8:22-26

If you were there on Sunday, or listened to the podcast, sum up why Jesus healed in stages in the verses.

Do you think God works the exact same way in everyone? How have you seen God work in people differently?
