

If you have heard it once in churches you have heard it a hundred times, "you must be born again." Most of the time that rings so familiar to us we don't even pause to think about the ramifications of what that actually means. In John 3 it is refreshing that Nicodemus is so willing to put into words what we should all be saying when we hear Jesus' words of being born again, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?"

Nicodemus is a member of the Jewish ruling council, the Sanhedrin, which is indicative of a few things:

- 1. He is old.
- 2. He was a man.
- 3. He was rich.
- 4. He was highly educated.

Nicodemus is part of the cultural elite and he is *not* seeking Jesus in this encounter. Nicodemus seeks Jesus out at night and says, "Rabbi, <u>we</u> know you're a teacher." These words lets us know he is representing 'the establishment' and the establishment is *against* Jesus.

Jesus' words of being born again are directed to a heart and a life that thinks they have everything figured out. Nicodemus is the opposite of a broken or emotionally volatile person, he's a Pharisee. Pharisees had hundreds of rules they were required to follow. Jesus' call to the new birth is not a call to morality and religion; it's a *challenge* to morality and religion. Jesus chooses the one person who doesn't smoke, doesn't drink, and doesn't sleep around who is absolutely impeccable and says, "You have to born again."

The message of the new birth is not a call to more morality and moral structure; it's a challenge to it. Everyone starts at ground zero.

INTRODUCTION

Jesus had a thorough understanding of human nature. When we read the words of the exchange between Jesus and Nicodemus we must realize that His words are also meant for us as well. Jesus knows us better than we know ourselves because we are afraid to be honest with ourselves about how bad we really are, this is why Jesus relates salvation to being born again and starting fresh.

DISCUSSION

Imagine you had never heard the bible before and someone told you that you needed to be born again. How would you respond?

EXPLANATION

Timothy Keller says, "There has never been a message more radically against morality and religion than the message of the new birth."

How would you define "new birth?"

How is new birth NOT a call to morality?

Is there a reason why people who have been 'born again' seem to be more moral?

In what ways is new birth something everyone needs?
